Training content	<p>I. Main Training Content</p> <p>1. Program Overview: This program centers on the theme of "ICAO Safety Audit Standards," addressing the practical needs of Belt and Road countries in civil aviation safety development. It focuses on core topics such as aviation safety oversight systems, key points of compliance auditing, operational standards assessment, and corrective action mechanisms. The curriculum</p>	

covers the ICAO Universal Safety Oversight Audit Programme – Continuous Monitoring Approach (USOAP CMA), relevant legal and regulatory frameworks, and critical audit areas including aircraft operations, airport management, flight standards, and aviation security. Drawing on China's practical experience in audit preparation and corrective implementation, the program integrates theoretical instruction, case analysis, simulated audits, and group discussions to help participants gain a comprehensive understanding of international standards and strengthen their capabilities in audit response and implementation. The program provides strong support for enhancing compliance management and improving operational safety within national civil aviation systems.

These activities will further enhance participants' professional capabilities in aviation safety assessment, audit response, risk control, and operational compliance, supporting their efforts to improve national aviation systems and align with international standards.
