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About the Organizer	<p>Beijing Jiaotong University is a national key university directly under the Ministry of Education, jointly established by the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Transport, the Beijing Municipal People's Government, and China Railway Group Co., Ltd. It is a national "211 Project", "985 Project Advantage Discipline Innovation Platform", and "Double First Class" construction university. It is the first higher education institution in China to cultivate railway professionals according to the modern education system. After the development of the Double First Class, the school has formed a comprehensive disciplinary training system with advantages in information and management disciplines, characteristics in transportation science and technology, and coordinated development of multiple disciplines such as engineering, management, economics, science, literature, law, and philosophy.</p> <p>Beijing Jiaotong University started its foreign aid training program in the 1970s, under the personal care of Premier Zhou Enlai, to provide training for personnel on the Tanzania Zambia Railway. Since 2006, our school has undertaken a total of 178 short-term training courses commissioned by the Ministry of Commerce, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the National Railway Administration, China Railway Group Limited, and other domestic and foreign institutions, with 4,261 participants. This includes 140 foreign aid training programs with 3,540 participants, covering more than 80 countries and regions in Asia, Europe, Africa, the Americas, and Oceania. The training formats include training in China, remote online training, and on-site training in target countries abroad. In 2024, our school undertook and completed a total of 25 foreign aid training projects, training 588 participants, and received unanimous praise from higher-level departments, embassies abroad, and the trainees. On 17th January, 2024, general secretary Xi Jinping has replied to the representatives of our school's Kenyan students and alumni, which is a great encouragement for our school to promote the construction of a community with a shared future for mankind through studying in China and foreign aid training under the Belt and Road Initiative.</p> <p>Beijing Jiaotong University organizes international training programs focusing on human resource development in developing countries, covering areas such as rail transit construction and operation and maintenance, infrastructure construction and maintenance, urban and rural planning, enterprise management, environmental protection, and sustainable development. Each training session is tailored to the strengths of the university and the characteristics of the training participants, with reasonable arrangements for classroom lectures, on-site teaching, and professional visits.</p>	
Training content	<p>I. Main Training Contents</p> <p>1. Environmental Law and Citizens' Responsibilities: Through classroom lectures, introduce the legal frameworks for environmental protection in China and other countries and regions. Focus on teachings regarding the Paris Agreement, the Environmental Protection Law of China, etc. Summarize citizens' environmental rights and obligations, and analyze typical environmental litigation cases, such as public interest litigations on air pollution.</p> <p>2. Overview of the Development Process and Current Situation of International Environmental Protection Rule of Law: Through classroom lectures, review the development process of international environmental protection law. From aspects such as the implementation of multilateral agreements, participation in global governance, and responses to emerging issues, conduct an in-depth analysis of its current framework, operation effectiveness, and the challenges it faces.</p> <p>3. Overview of the Legal Norms for Environmental Protection in China: Through classroom lectures, introduce China's environmental protection provisions in the Constitution, the basic environmental protection law, special regulations in various fields, environmental standards,</p>	

and the law enforcement and judicial systems. Explain the significance of the concept of "adhering to using the strictest systems and the most rigorous rule of law to protect the ecological environment" in promoting national legislation.

4. Overview of the Legal Experience and Achievements of China's Green Development: Through classroom lectures combined with on-site practical visits, introduce China's remarkable legal achievements in ecological restoration, energy conservation and emission reduction, the rise of green industries, and other aspects.

5. Green Economy and Social Transformation: Through classroom lectures, introduce low-carbon economy, environmental resource pricing, ecological compensation mechanisms, green consumption models, carbon trading market mechanisms, etc., and compare the differences between traditional economy and circular economy.

6. Environmental Policies and the Rule of Law: Through classroom lectures, introduce the logic of environmental legislation, the difficulties in law enforcement, international environmental treaties (such as the Convention on Biological Diversity), and the interpretation of domestic "dual carbon" policies.

7. Ecological Engineering and Green Technologies: Through practical teaching, experience pollution treatment technologies such as wastewater treatment and solid waste resource utilization, as well as the application of clean energy sources such as photovoltaics and hydrogen energy, and ecological restoration projects.

8. Legal Cooperation Mechanisms under the Belt and Road Initiative: Through exchange and discussion, study the connotation and importance of the legal cooperation mechanisms related to the Belt and Road Initiative, analyze the legal differences and challenges among countries along the routes, and explore the paths and strategies for constructing and improving legal cooperation mechanisms in multiple fields such as environmental protection, trade, and investment.

II. Arrangements for Visits and Inspections (The cities for visits and inspections may be adjusted according to the actual situation)

It is planned to arrange officials from countries along the Belt and Road Initiative who come to China for training to visit the History Museum of Beijing Jiaotong University and the National Key Laboratory of Autonomous Operation of Advanced Rail Transit on campus. They will go to the CRRC Erqi Intelligent Manufacturing Base, the Traffic Control Technology Co., Ltd., as well as relevant judicial institutions such as the courts and procuratorates inside and outside Beijing, and leading enterprises in the transportation field like CRRC Corporation Limited for on-site teaching, so as to learn the advanced experience of China's safe development in the transportation industry and the construction of the rule of law. Outside Beijing, the trainees are planned to take the high-speed rail to Datong, Shanxi Province, and visit the courts, procuratorates, coal enterprises and new energy enterprises in Datong to learn about the legal measures for environmental protection in Datong.
