About the Organizer	<p>International Exchange and Cooperation Center (IECC) is a public welfare institution affiliated to the Ministry of Emergency Management of China.</p> <p>IECC mainly undertakes international exchanges and cooperation with foreign non-governmental organizations and private institutions in the field of emergency management. IECC engages in emergency management-related information studies, technical consultation, China-aided training programs, and services on foreign affairs. IECC also involves in activities of international rescue and cooperation as a professional and technical service unit in the field of emergency management.</p> <p>Since its establishment, IECC has implemented a series of intergovernmental cooperation projects successively, including China-Europe Cooperation Project on Occupational Safety and Health, China-US Cooperation Project on Mine Safety, China-Australia Demonstration Cooperation Project on Coal Mine Safety, and China-Japan Cooperation Project on Coal Mine Safety Training, etc.</p> <p>As the initiating and implementing unit for China-aided training programs within the Ministry of Emergency Management, IECC has collected rich experience in China-aided training. Since 2016, IECC has developed extensive exchanges and cooperation on work safety and disaster prevention and reduction with Lancang-Mekong and ASEAN countries. These activities, through trainings, workshops, and research projects, have helped cultivate a group of safety inspectors for ASEAN countries, greatly enhancing people-to-people exchanges between China and Lancang-Mekong and ASEAN countries in the field of emergency management. The Belt and Road International Cooperation Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Management (BRIDRREM) was established in 2023. IECC has taken part in organizing three China-aided training programs, including Belt and Road 1000-Person Training Program in Emergency Management, Belt and Road Capacity Building Program for Mine Safety Management and Belt and Road Capacity Building Program for Workplace Safety Risk Prevention and Control.</p> <p>IECC has successfully completed the implementation of 39 training sessions in 2024 involving in 67 countries and 1,000 participants in total.</p> <p>In addition, IECC has organized the 2024 Belt and Road Emergency Management Youth Exchange Program, 36 young officials and scholars from disaster management departments in 26 countries (including international organizations), which are respectively Afghanistan, Kyrgyzstan, Myanmar, Cambodia, Pakistan, Republic of Belarus, and Serbia, were offered a 7-day training and exchange program.</p>	
Training content	<p>1. Main training content</p> <p>(1) Introduction to China's National Conditions and Xi Jinping Thought on Socialism with Chinese Characteristics for a New Era: Lectures on China's reform and opening-up and economic development experience, providing participants with a foundational understanding of China's basic situation, fostering an objective perception of China, and promoting international exchange.</p> <p>(2) Organizational Structure and Management of China's Emergency Medical System: Introduction to the multi-level framework and collaborative management mechanisms of China's emergency medical system, covering policy frameworks, resource allocation, and the development of information platforms.</p> <p>(3) Interdisciplinary Cooperation and Integration in Disaster Rescue:</p>	

	<p>Exploration of multi-sector collaboration models (medical, firefighting, engineering, etc.) in disaster scenarios, establishing a "peacetime-wartime integration" joint command system. Case studies will demonstrate information sharing, task allocation, and cross-disciplinary resource integration.</p> <p>(4) On-Site Emergency Response and First Aid in Disasters: Focus on triage techniques and standardized pre-hospital emergency procedures (e.g., hemorrhage control, airway management), incorporating wearable technology and other advanced tools to enhance rescue efficiency.</p> <p>(5) Application of Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) in Emergency Rescue: Introduction to the clinical value of TCM techniques (e.g., acupuncture for pain relief, herbal medicine for shock treatment) in emergencies, along with integrated Chinese-Western medical solutions.</p> <p>(6) 5G+ Community Early Warning and Pre-Hospital Emergency Capability Enhancement: Discussion on China's latest 5G advancements and their practical applications in emergency medical response.</p> <p>(7) Construction and Management of Chinese Medical Teams in UN Framework Rescue Missions: Alignment with INSARAG standards to strengthen international rescue team certification, analyzing personnel training, modular equipment systems, and cross-border coordination. Case studies will highlight China's standardized operations in global rescue missions.</p> <p>(8) Psychological Crisis Intervention and Support in Emergencies: Training on psychological characteristics during crises, key intervention techniques, and tailored rehabilitation programs for rescuers, survivors, and affected families.</p> <p>(9) AI-Driven Smart Emergency Medicine and Industry-Academia-Research Collaboration: Demonstration of AI-powered medical devices in emergency scenarios and discussion on the industrialization pathways of medical robotics.</p> <p>2. Study tour arrangements (Cities to be visited may be adjusted according to actual situation) The program plans to organize participants to conduct field exchanges and study visits in Shenzhen. They will visit Shenzhen Ninth People's Hospital (Shenzhen Base of National Emergency Medical Research Center), Huawei Technologies Co., Ltd., and EdgeMedical to learn about China's developments in emergency medical services, real-time communication technologies for emergency medical rescue operations, and intelligent manufacturing of emergency medical equipment. The program includes visits to historical and cultural sites such as the Great Wall and Tian Tong Yuan Market to experience China's cultural heritage and local customs, as well as study tours to Shenzhen's Lotus Hill Park, the statues of DENG Xiaoping, and Yantian Port to gain insights into China's reform and opening-up journey.</p> <p>3. About the lecturers The Ministry of Emergency Management will invite Renmin University of China, China Foreign Affairs University, Beijing Emergency Medical Center, and the Institute of Psychology, Chinese Academy of Sciences, etc. to send experts to participate in the seminar.</p> <p>4. Others Introduction to team building (1) Before the training, organize the participants to attend fun and engaging ice-breaking games, and promote mutual familiarity among participants from different countries; (2) Before the training, brief the participants on the main objectives of the training, the training schedule and other information, and help them quickly engage in the training; (3) After the training, organize the participants to share their training insights with the training project management team. Facilitate a bilateral exchange, make a summary, and fill out the survey and evaluation form. Materials to be prepared by participants In order to facilitate communication with Chinese experts, the participants should prepare materials related to the topic of the seminar: (1) Self-introduction of the individual and the affiliated unit; (2) Current status and challenges in emergency medicine in crisis situations in YOUR Country. (3) Basis and prospects of cooperation with China in the field of emergency medicine in crisis situations.</p>
