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About the Organizer	<p>Hunan Children's Hospital, as the Pediatric China-aid Medical Training Unit in China and Medical Aid Training Base in Hunan Province, is a comprehensive children's hospital which integrates clinic, scientific research and teaching. Furnished with 1,800 beds and staffed with 2,000 employees, the Hospital has 8 national-level key clinical specialties, 12 provincial-level key clinical specialties, 1 national key laboratory (cultivation) program, 2 provincial-level key laboratories, 10 provincial-level clinical research centers, 14 provincial-level clinical diagnostic and treatment centers, and 1 post-doctoral workstation. The Hospital is striving to build a national children's regional medical center. In 2010, the Hospital established the School of Pediatrics in cooperation with Nanhua University, and was authorized as the Children's Hospital affiliated with Xiangya School of Medicine of Central South University in 2023. An independent China-aid management department, International Cooperation and Exchange Center, was set up. It is the Training Base for Maternal & Child Health for Belt and Road Countries awarded by the National Health Commission and the United Nations Children's Fund; Key International Pediatric Medical Center and Hunan Medical Aid Training Base awarded by Hunan Health Commission; International Science and Technology Cooperation Base and Academician Workstation granted by Department of Science and Technology of Hunan Province.</p> <p>The Hospital has organized 120 training projects since 2006 for over 4000 medical administrators and technicians from 108 countries and regions. The training includes over 10 topics such as pediatric severe disease, neonatal medicine, pediatric care technology, maternal and child health care, laboratory techniques, traditional Chinese medicine and hospital management. English, French, Portuguese, Mongolian, Arabic, Russian are used for teaching. The training courses centering on prevention and treatment of pediatric common diseases have been successfully held for 12 sessions so far, and a total of 312 medical personnel have come to our hospital for training and exchange. The trainees feel good and gain a lot. The project has been highly recognized and praised by the governments, trainees and colleagues of their countries, and it is of great significance to enhance the pediatric capacity in developing countries. It is hoped that the Chinese government will continue to organize relevant training programs to impart China's successful experience and practices in pediatric to developing countries.</p> <p>In active response to China's Belt and Road Initiative, Hunan Children's Hospital, in collaboration with more than 10 children's medical institutions, research institutes and international organizations at home and abroad, founded the Children's Health Alliance for Developing Countries in 2018. Following the principle of shared growth through discussion</p>	

	<p>and collaboration, the Alliance aims to build a “home” concept based on children’s health for developing countries, and to share appropriate pediatric technology, prevention and treatment of children’s diseases, offer training to pediatric personnel, collaborate in scientific research and facilitate children’s health industry. To increase China’s visibility, the Hospital developed the precise assistance model of pediatric treatment technology by combining the medical features and needs of the recipient countries, thereby reaching the hearts of people with the “small but beautiful” project. Via People’s Daily, CCTV, overseas local media and other information channels, a series of timely reports were published, which not only shared the experience in pediatric health care and scientific research for further collaboration, but also enhanced people’s understanding of China’s healthcare undertakings.</p>
Training content	<p>1. Classroom Teaching + Case Teaching: The training focuses on thematic courses covering common diseases across various organ systems, including respiratory, digestive, cardiovascular, and neurological diseases, infectious diseases, as well as training in diagnostic and treatment protocols, clinical guidelines, child preventive healthcare, new technology sharing, and clinical research capabilities. Essential emergency skills training—Basic Life Support (BLS) and Advanced Life Support (ALS) courses—will be conducted to strengthen healthcare professionals’ pediatric emergency techniques, such as cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), endotracheal intubation, and neonatal resuscitation. Through foundational medical knowledge training, the program introduces child growth and development, enabling trainees to grasp developmental patterns from the neonatal period to adolescence, encompassing physical and neuropsychological development, thereby identifying normal and abnormal developmental conditions and detecting health risks caused by developmental issues. This comprehensive approach equips trainees with the competencies required of pediatricians.</p> <p>2. Professional practice and field visits: The program aims to integrate theoretical knowledge with hands-on practice to enhance participants’ clinical skills. During professional practice, trainees will engage in practical operations at provincial and municipal hospitals in Hunan Province, focusing on core procedures such as neonatal care, diagnosis and treatment of pediatric respiratory infections, and diarrheal disease prevention and treatment. Moreover, we focus on malnutrition assessment, vaccination protocols, and strategies for infectious disease control. Hospital professionals will provide on-site guidance and feedback to ensure technical correctness. Additionally, visits to community health service centers will be organized to observe grassroots child health management systems, smart vaccination clinics, and health education initiatives, offering insights into advanced pediatric disease management practices. Trainees will interact with hospital staff to deepen their understanding of China’s pediatric healthcare landscape and emerging trends. These activities will provide firsthand exposure to China’s pediatric care realities, equipping participants to improve local disease prevention and treatment upon returning their country. The program will also include visits to pharmaceutical enterprises, enabling trainees to explore advancements in China’s medical industry.</p> <p>3. Cultural experience: A special Chinese culture experience course is set up. Chinese music, chess, calligraphy, painting, clothing, food, housing, and transportation are presented in a form accessible to both the refined and the popular, such as tea art performances, opera performances, calligraphy experiences, and tasting of delicious food. This allows participants to experience the rich and colorful Chinese culture, the perfect integration of culture and life, and deepens their understanding of Chinese culture, spirit, and strength.</p> <p>4.
