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About the Organizer	<p>Chinese Red Cross National Training Center (“Training Center”) was established on June 14, 1983. For more than 20 years, Training Center abides by the fundamental principles of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, and upholds the spirit of the Red Cross Society—“humanitarian, fraternity and dedication”. It has experienced three development stages, namely “hotel management”, “hotel management and first-aid training” and “hotel management, first-aid training and major public welfare program implementation”. Training Center has given full play to its unique role and influence in terms of first-aid training, Red Cross staff training, health and safety education training, foreign aid etc. as a nationwide training institution of the Red Cross system. Also, it has formed a development pattern led by program management, while based on first-aid training and hotel management.</p> <p>Main business: In terms of training development: first, the Red Cross first-aid training, with an aim to promote to people’s capacity related knowledge and skills in disaster prevention and reduction, emergency shelter, self and mutual medical aid; second, Red Cross staff training, intended to organize knowledge and skills training targeting at grassroots staff; third, international training, inviting Red Cross personnel of the developing countries to China and enable them to have a comprehensive understanding of our current works, sharing our success experience, and meanwhile organizing RC staff to study abroad, so as to learn management mode and developing experience of public organizations in developed countries. In terms of program management: core programs funded by the Red Cross Society of China, IFRC, ICRC, and NSs (including Integrated Community Resilience, First-aid, Emergency Rescue programs); Red Cross life, health and safety education programs funded by the Ministry of Finance; reproductive health projects and other humane management and public welfare program implementation works supported by the United Nations Population Fund.</p>	
Training content	<p>1. Main Training Contents</p> <p>(1) China's National Conditions and Achievements of Reform and Opening Up: Introduction to China's political, social and historical development and achievements of reform and opening up;</p> <p>(2) The emergency search & rescue system of the China: Paths and Practices for Comprehensively Enhancing China's National Integrated Capacity in Disaster Prevention, Mitigation, Relief and Recovery;</p> <p>(3) China's Disaster Management and Emergency Rescue Practices: An Overview of International Rescue Operations and Case Sharing of China's Participation in International Rescue Missions□</p> <p>(5) Emergency Rescue work of RCSC: Introduction to the emergency rescue system and mechanisms, as well as the construction of emergency rescue volunteer teams, of the Red Cross Society of China□</p> <p>(6) Case Study on Emergency Rescue: Using simulated cases as a starting point, organize participants to form groups, develop rescue plans, and collaboratively discuss and refine rescue strategies;</p> <p>(7) RCSC’s International Cooperation and humanitarian assistance of RCSC: share mechanisms and relief practices of international cooperation & humanitarian assistance work of RCSC.</p> <p>(8) Basic theory of Emergency Search & Rescue: share the basic concepts and principles of urban search & rescue□</p>	

	<p>(9) Emergency Search & Rescue techniques: introduce the rescue equipment and basic operation of search & rescue techniques□</p> <p>(10) First aid knowledge and skills: lectures, demonstration and competition of first aid knowledge and skills, including basic knowledge on cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), CPR procedures and skills, how to use automatic external defibrillator (AED), causes, determination, symptoms, first aid skills of airway foreign body obstruction (AFBO), first aid for trauma, etc.</p> <p>2. Discussion and Exchange</p> <p>(1) Participants exchange their thoughts on emergency rescue work with related experts from RCSC.</p> <p>(2) Participants discuss the current challenges and related cases of emergency search & rescue work in their own countries.</p> <p>(3) Participants share the history, culture and national conditions of their own countries.</p> <p>3. Field Visit</p> <p>(1) During the stay in Beijing, all the participants will be organized to visit the Disaster Preparedness and Response Center of the Red Cross Society of China, Rescue Service Center of Red Cross Society of China Beijing Branch, etc.</p> <p>(2) During the stay in Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region, all the participants will be organized to visit the Disaster Preparedness and Relief Center of RCSC Nanning Branch, Baise Red Cross Search and Rescue Training Base, etc.</p> <p>4. Cultural Experience</p> <p>(1) Chinese cultural life experience: Chinese learning and dumpling making.</p> <p>(2) Chinese history, culture and social life experience: Through the tour of the Great Wall, the Summer Palace or other historical and cultural sites, and the experience of the Silk, Pearl market and other commodity markets, to understand the heritage of Chinese culture, local customs, experience the real life of ordinary Chinese people.</p> <p>5. Team Building Activities</p> <p>(1) Ice-breaking: participants will be invited to carry out fun team building activities to get familiar with each other.</p> <p>(2) Seminar instruction: main objectives, detailed arrangements and other information of the seminar will be introduced to the participants to help them know more about the seminar. Meanwhile, training needs and questionnaires will be collected.</p> <p>(3) Summing-up meeting: comments & suggestions will be highly appreciated and collected from the participants in the end of the seminar.</p> <p>6.
