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| About the Organizer | <p>International Exchange and Cooperation Center (IECC) is a public welfare institution affiliated to the Ministry of Emergency Management of China.</p> <p>IECC mainly undertakes international exchanges and cooperation with foreign non-governmental organizations and private institutions in the field of emergency management. IECC engages in emergency management-related information studies, technical consultation, China-aided training programs, and services on foreign affairs. IECC also involves in activities of international rescue and cooperation as a professional and technical service unit in the field of emergency management.</p> <p>Since its establishment, IECC has implemented a series of intergovernmental cooperation projects successively, including China-Europe Cooperation Project on Occupational Safety and Health, China-US Cooperation Project on Mine Safety, China-Australia Demonstration Cooperation Project on Coal Mine Safety, and China-Japan Cooperation Project on Coal Mine Safety Training, etc.</p> <p>As the initiating and implementing unit for China-aided training programs within the Ministry of Emergency Management, IECC has collected rich experience in China-aided training. Since 2016, IECC has developed extensive exchanges and cooperation on work safety and disaster prevention and reduction with Lancang-Mekong and ASEAN countries. These activities, through trainings, workshops, and research projects, have helped cultivate a group of safety inspectors for ASEAN countries, greatly enhancing people-to-people exchanges between China and Lancang-Mekong and ASEAN countries in the field of emergency management. The Belt and Road International Cooperation Framework for Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Management (BRIDRREM) was established in 2023. IECC has taken part in organizing three China-aided training programs, including Belt and Road 1000-Person Training Program in Emergency Management, Belt and Road Capacity Building Program for Mine Safety Management and Belt and Road Capacity Building Program for Workplace Safety Risk Prevention and Control.</p> <p>IECC has successfully completed the implementation of 39 training sessions in 2024 involving in 67 countries and 1,000 participants in total.</p> <p>In addition, IECC has organized the 2024 Belt and Road Emergency Management Youth Exchange Program, 36 young officials and scholars from disaster management departments in 26 countries (including international organizations), which are respectively Afghanistan, Kyrgyzstan, Myanmar, Cambodia, Pakistan, Republic of Belarus, and Serbia, were offered a 7-day training and exchange program.</p> |   |
| Training content    | <p>I.Main training content</p> <p>1.National conditions course: systematically presents China's development landscape to participants from partner countries to facilitate international collaboration in emergency management. The content will cover China's achievements and experiences in reform and opening-up, as well as Xi Jinping Thought on Socialism with Chinese Characteristics for a New Era.</p> <p>2.Organizational Structure and Management of China's Emergency Medical System: Introduces the multi-level framework and coordinated management mechanisms of China's emergency medical system, covering policy frameworks, resource allocation, and information platform development.</p> <p>3.International Policies, Rules, and Standards for Cross-Border Rescue: Presents global</p>  |   |

frameworks such as the UN INSARAG Guidelines and WHO Emergency Medical Teams (EMT) Initiative, training participants to be familiar with multilateral coordination mechanisms and host-country medical access protocols.

4.Capacity Building for Cross-Border Emergency Medical Teams: Uses the UN INSARAG Heavy Team certification modules to explain team structure, personnel selection, competency development, and SOP formulation.

5.Action Planning, Information Management, and Coordination in Cross-Border Rescue: Basing on real cases to introduce how rescue teams establish on-site action planning, integrate rescue management systems, coordinate with RDC/UCC and other teams, and establish local partnerships in disaster-stricken areas.

6.Logistics Support for Cross-Border Emergency Medical Operations: Focuses on medical supply chain management in extreme environments, including modular equipment pre-positioning, cross-border cold-chain drug transport, and emergency power solutions.

7.Chinese Traditional Culture and International Humanitarian Law: Explores ethical synergies between Confucian principles (e.g., "benevolence" and "harmony in diversity") and humanitarian norms to discuss the ethical value of Chinese culture in cross-cultural rescue.

8.Advances in China's Emergency Medical Equipment Technology: Introducing and showcasing innovations in disaster medical devices, discussing Standardized interface design for Modular equipment, cross-border verification process and joint R&D potential in align with the needs of Belt and Road countries. In this way, Chinese solutions will be transformed into international public goods.

9.Occupational Health Management for Rescue Personnel: Training rescue personnel on full-cycle health management protocols including Occupational health protection, medical surveillance, and rehabilitation for sustained operational readiness.

10.5G+ Community Early Warning and Enhancing Pre-Hospital Rescue Capability: Demonstrates China's 5G development and applications in emergency response.

II. Study tour arrangements (Cities to be visited may be adjusted according to actual situation)  
It is proposed to arrange a visit to Haikou City, Hainan Province, which involves visiting to Hainan Medical University, the Hospital affiliated to Hainan Medical University/ Hainan National Emergency Medicine Research Center, and institutions including Boao Lecheng Medical Tourism Pilot Zone to know the development of maritime rescue in China.  
The seminar plans to invite participants to visit historical scenic spots including the Great Wall and other attractions such as, Tian Tongyuan Market to appreciate China's profound and time-honored traditional culture. What's more, participants will gain a deeper understanding of China's development road by visiting to Wenchang Aerospace Scientific Center, Red Women Army Memorial, and China (Hainan) Museum of the South China Sea.

III. About the lecturers  
The Ministry of Emergency Management will invite experts from The Ministry of Emergency Management, Renmin University of China, China Foreign Affairs University, The People's Liberation Army General Hospital and Medical School, The Chinese Red Cross, Institute of Psychology of the Chinese Academy of Sciences to participate in the exchanges and discussions and on-site teaching.

IV.Others  
1.Before the training, organize the participants to attend fun and engaging ice-breaking games, and promote mutual familiarity among participants from different countries;  
2.Before the training, brief the participants on the main objectives of the training, the training schedule and other information, and help them quickly engage in the training;  
3.After the training, organize the participants to share their training insights with the training project management team. Facilitate a bilateral exchange, make a summary, and fill out the survey and evaluation form.
