(3) Xi Jinping Thought on Governance and Socioeconomic Development: to introduce Xi Jinping Thought on Governance and its guiding role in economic and social development policies. (4) China's Statistical Departments and Functions: to introduce the statistical departments of the Chinese government and their functions, including the statistical caliber and approach of China. (5) Selection and Changes of Statistical Indicators for China's National Economy: to introduce the setup and development of China's national economic statistical system, as well as its basis for selection and variation of statistical indicators. (6) China's Methods of Statistics Collection and Economic Census: to offer an overview of the methods of statistics collection and economic census in China.
