Cybersecurity Awareness Month 2025 with strong national participation**

Throughout October, participants benefited from interactive training sessions and expert-led discussions featuring cybersecurity professionals from CARICOM IMPACS, iGovTT, the Trinidad and Tobago Air Guard, CISCO Ltd., Fortinet, the TTPS Cyber and Social Media Unit, RSC International, TT-CSIRT and the Computer Forensics and Security Institute (CFSI). These sessions explored practical strategies to detect and prevent phishing, social engineering and other cyber threats, while deepening understanding of AI, data privacy and digital hygiene.

As a key outcome of the initiative, participants will be awarded *Certificates of Participation* in recognition of their participation and commitment to strengthening their cybersecurity knowledge. In addition, recorded recaps of the training sessions are being curated and hosted to provide continued access to learning resources and to preserve the knowledge shared throughout the month.
