About the Organizer	Founded in 1964, Jiangxi Vocational College of Foreign Studies is the only higher vocational college dominated by training foreign language and foreign economic and trade application-oriented talents in Jiangxi Province. It is a construction unit of the high-standard programs construction plan with Chinese characteristics, a co-developed college of the People's Government of Jiangxi Province and the Ministry of Commerce of China, and one of the first batches of MOFCOM Training Bases for International Business Officials. The college is a national high-quality higher vocational college, and one of the first batch of Demonstrative Higher Vocational Colleges in Jiangxi Province. It was awarded the title of one of the Top 50 Vocational Colleges of International Influence in China for two consecutive years. The college now has two campuses in Yaohu and Wangcheng respectively. The campuses boast a combination of Chinese and western characteristics and modern elegance. The college highlights foreign-oriented running features, sets up 47 majors, involving 11 languages, including English, Japanese, German, Korean, French, Arabic, Spanish, Portuguese, Russian, Italian, and Persian, and has rich translation resources and teachers reserve. The college has set up a special foreign aid training agency, equipped with more than 20 full-time management personnel, and hundreds of students are selected to work as volunteers, having created a high-quality, professional, and capable foreign aid training management team. Meanwhile, it has a fully equipped hotel integrating training, teaching, conference, and leisure, with strong reception capacity, providing participants with a comfortable learning and living environment. Since being approved as a "Training Base for International Business Officials" by the Ministry of Commerce in 2010, the college has been one of the first four such bases established nationwide. To date, the college has hosted a total of 346 training programs, including 3 overseas programs, training 8,760 government officials and technical personnel from 140 countries, regions, and international organizations. The training programs mainly cover 19 fields, including political parties, public administration, social security and social organizations, energy, mineral resources, foreign affairs, education, finance, commerce and trade, tourism, ecological protection and environmental governance, agriculture, forestry, animal husbandry and fishery, healthcare, manufacturing, information technology, scientific research and technical services, transportation and logistics, water resources, environment and disaster management, culture and sports, and construction. The programs range from ministerial seminars, director-general level seminars to technical training courses. The curriculum and field study activities are closely aligned with the program themes, the implementation is well-organized, the capacity to handle emergencies is strong, and the training outcomes are satisfactory. The college has received appreciation letters from participants in each program, and various domestic and international media have reported on its training activities, yielding good social benefits. The rich experience in foreign-aid training has laid a solid foundation for the college to continue undertaking national foreign-aid training tasks.

(1) National Conditions of China: introduce the current development, development concepts, and development initiatives of China.

(2) Local Government Management: Urban Infrastructure Development: introduce the status of urban infrastructure in Jiangxi Province, explore how to achieve integrated development and enhance residents' quality of life.

(3) China's Urban System and Layout: interpret the composition and spatial layout of China's urban system; analyze urban development logic and optimization pathways.

(4) Infrastructure Development and Public Finance Expenditure: introduce the role of infrastructure spending in public finance and share experience in the rational and effective use of funds.

(5) Practice and Exploration in Jiangxi Province's Ecological Civilization: draw on cases in Jiangxi Province to explain key practical points in ecological management and provide practicable methodologies.

(6) China's Digital Infrastructure and Smart City Development: systematically explain the layout of digital infrastructure; analyze smart city development models and innovative governance practice.

2. Symposium

(1) Country briefings by participants and discussions on the current status of urban infrastructure construction in each country.

(2) Q&A on points of interest and difficulties arising from professional courses.
